ITI Distribution : % Applied, Received and Accepted Offers, 2005

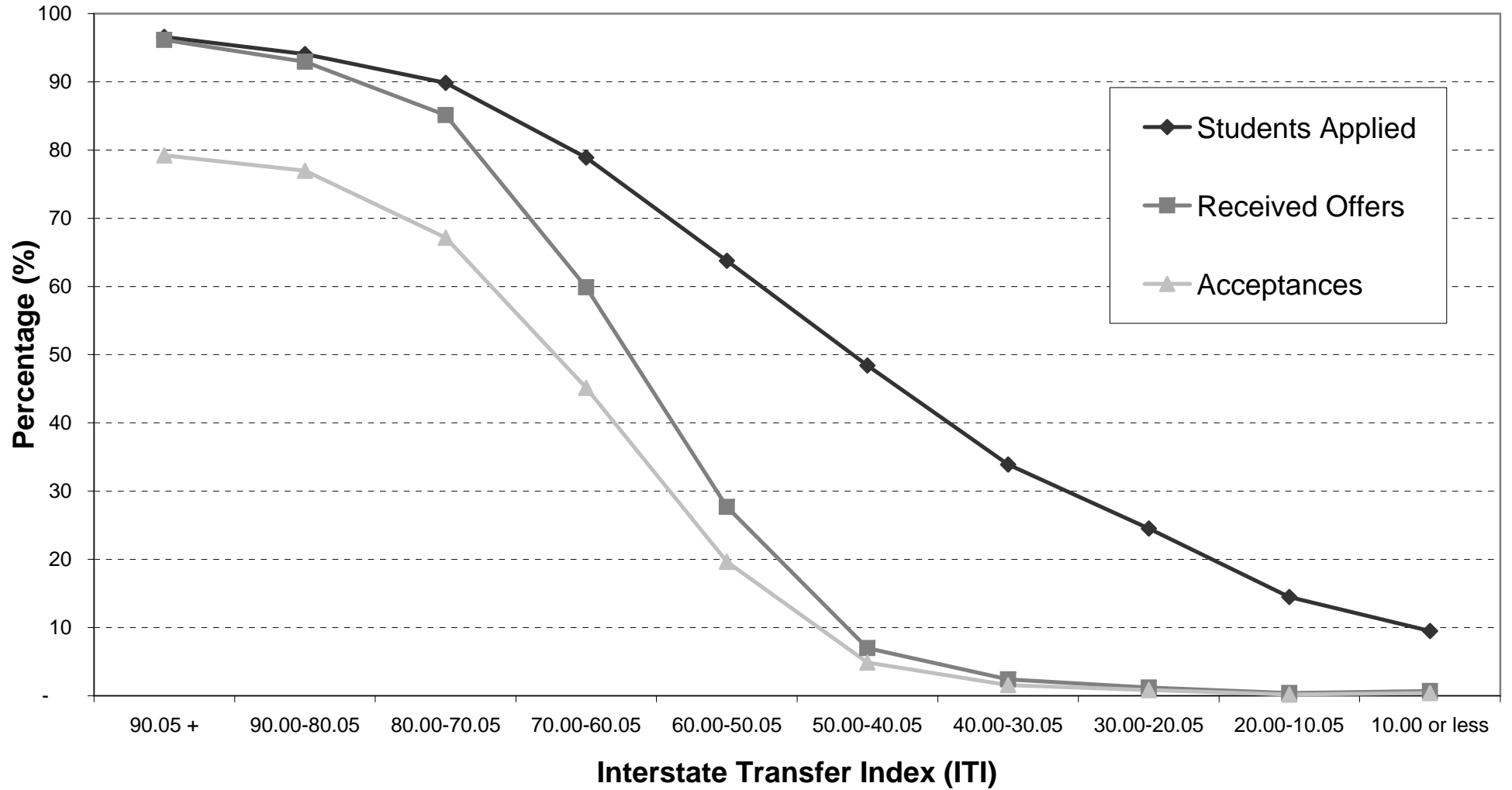

ITI of 90.05+: Applications and Offers by Field of Education, 2005

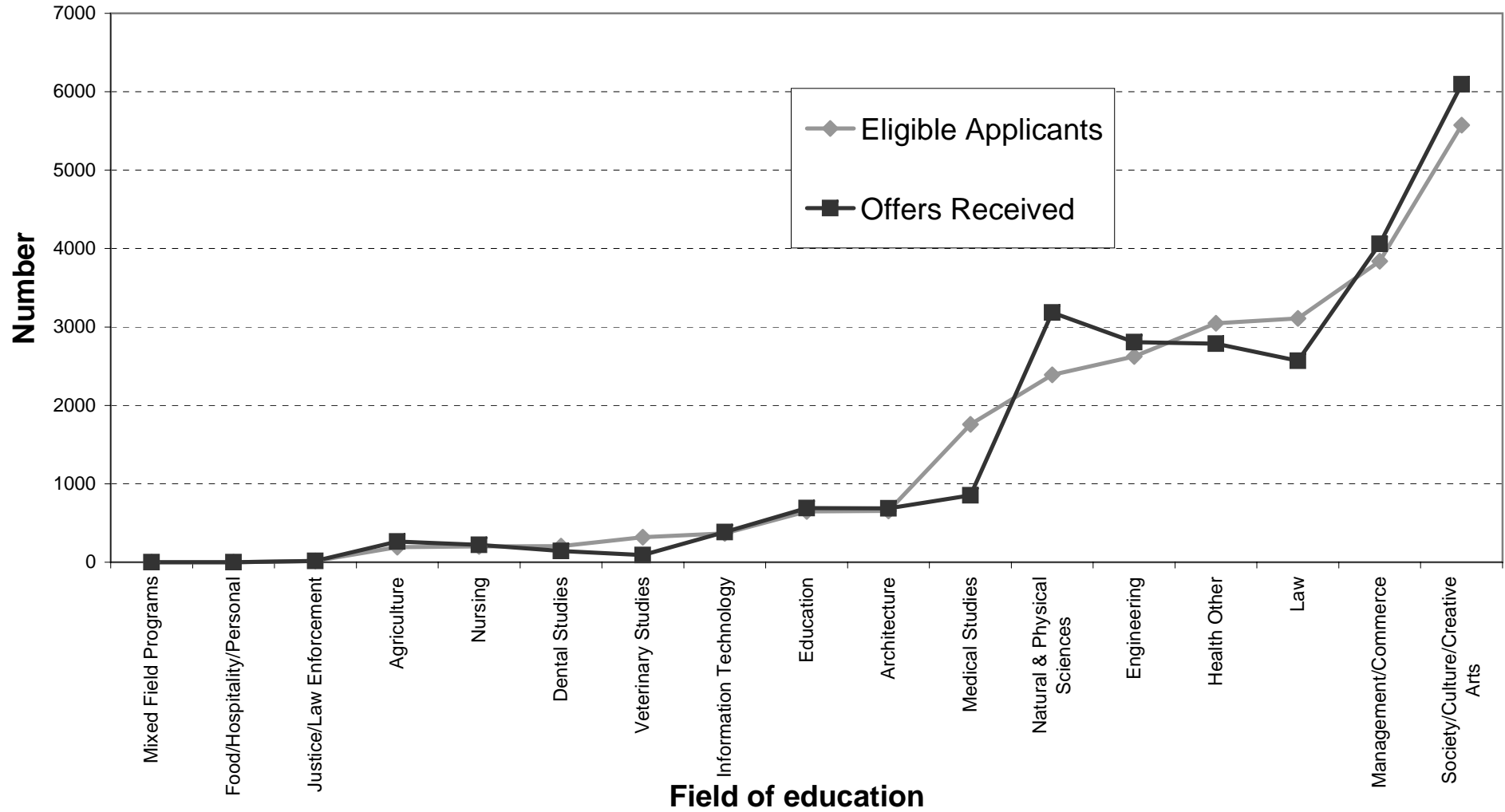

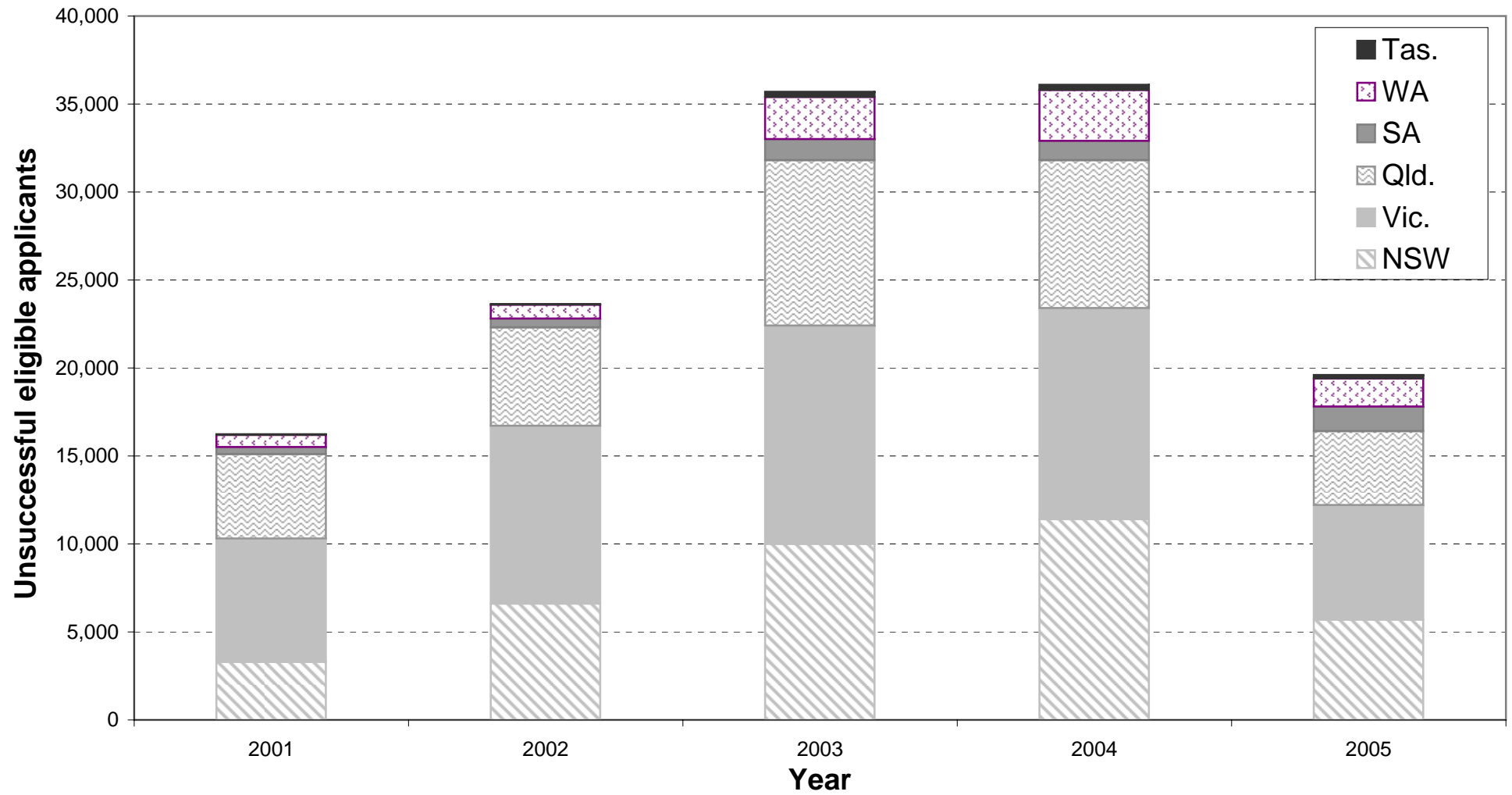

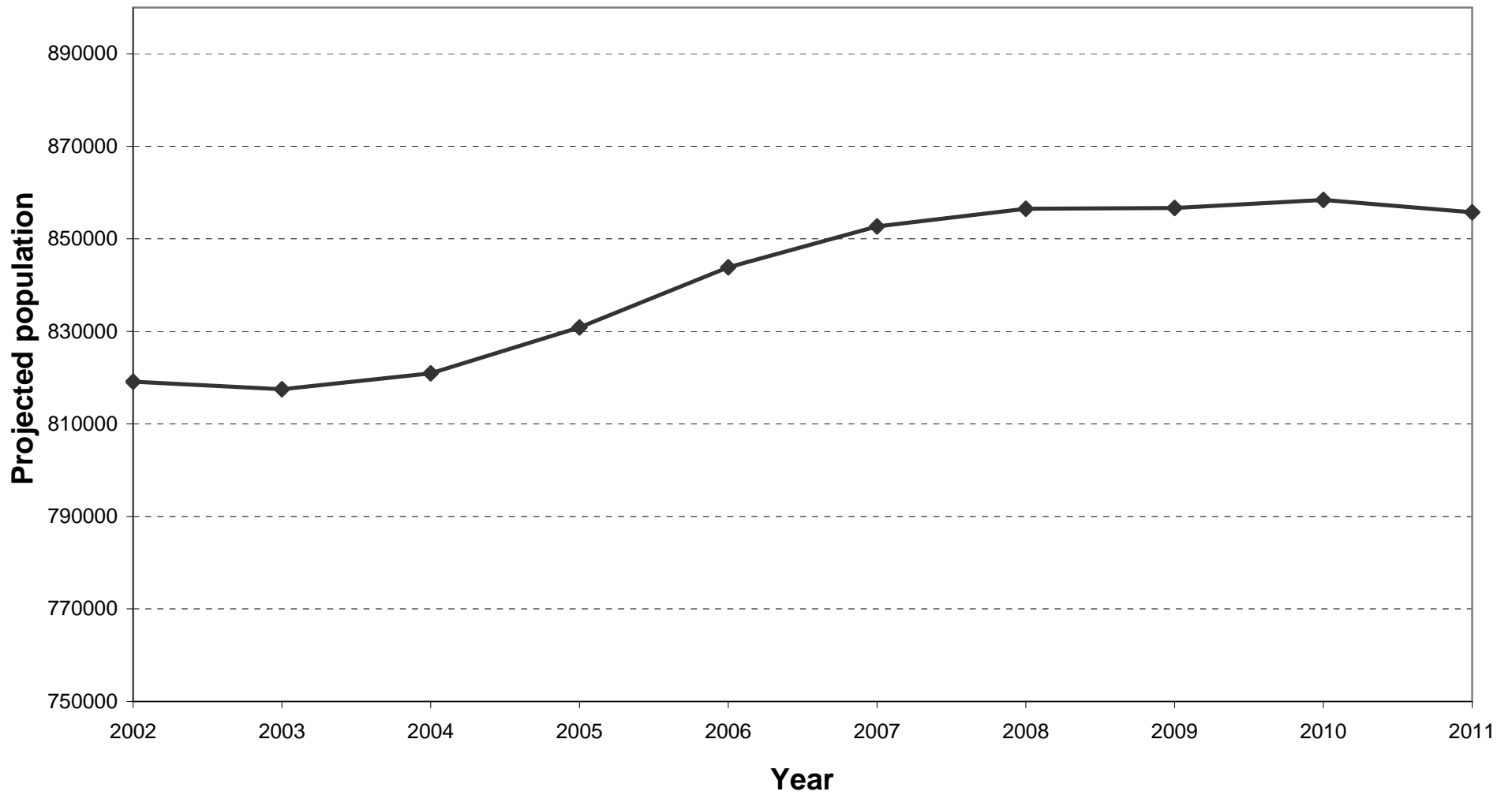
